

Sierra Vista Neighborhood Association meeting

May 9, 2016

Audrey Hargrave, Carol Mossardi, Ann Newberry, Rebecca Parmesano, Ann Wasgatt, Jim Kidd from RCONA, and Officer Loris were present.

Officer Loris gave a report that things are generally quiet in Sierra Vista Neighborhood. She said that there is a problem with high school students' driving, particularly on Monday when the officer is not at RHS, and they are working to control that. In response to a question about neighborhood parking feuds, she confirmed that there are no regulations for residential parking, so no one can be cited for obvious misconduct, for example, parking so as to block a neighbor's car from being moved. The officers try to resolve the conflicts.

Jim Kidd came to advise us as to how to keep the NA active. We have only 3 board members, not the required 5; we have not held elections because we cannot get a slate of willing board members; Ann has missed several RCONA meetings and we have no backup RCONA representative. His advice was

- ◆ to use the Movie in the Park night at Woodbridge to advertise and recruit. Rebecca Parmesano will take the mike before the movie and ask for participation. We will set up a poster and sign-up sheets before the movie.
- ◆ We should try to do National Night Out also [August 2nd] for visibility and recruiting.
- ◆ We also decided that changing the meeting times to 6:30 pm again would help people to manage to attend.
- ◆ Our goal is to come up with a slate of officers and hold elections in September or October. Currently Ann Newberry, president, Karen Perrin, treasurer, and Delia Snipes, member-at-large will continue to serve on the board until elections are held.

Jim also said that we don't need to ask people to come to meetings every month; we are only required to have quarterly meetings.
